

Minutes of Parish Council Meeting held on Thursday 9th July 2010

Declaration of interest: None

Acceptance of minutes of meeting of 10th June 2010. These were agreed as a true record and signed.

Matters arising: Dog bin for Sutton – bin now in situ.

Request from All Saints Church to help with the cost of a new notice board. Cllrs. agreed to support the church but considered it to be an expensive purchase and wish to be consulted on the size and positioning of the board. Agreed to give a maximum of £500.

Correspondence: Delivery of Local Services from NCC – After discussion it was decided to seek further information from NCC regarding Health & Safety, insurance and financial implications. Development of the Third local transport plan – questionnaire completed.

Parish Summer Sports Offer – 8 tickets for 20/20 cricket at Trent Bridge requested from RBC. Leadership Model Consultation, This was discussed and the Councilors agreed to recommend Option 1 Council leader and cabinet.

Cemetery: Cllr. Humphreys to draw up a rota for watering. Most of the plants have survived the very dry spell. The problem now is the thistles. Cllrs. Watchorn & Betts to trim. Clerk to speak to Hempsteads and request that area is now added to the current grass cutting contract.
